AKKS in Denmark:

What is AKKS

- AKKS is an umbrella organisation working for the right for everybody to participate in arts activities
- We have 12 member organisations covering a number of sub-organisations within:



- We cover 60.000 members organised in associations
- Half our members are defined as children and youth
- We are funded by the Lottery surplus
- . The staff consists of 1 part time employee, 10 volunteers and 1 person in a work scheme
- AKKS was founded in 1974 as a joint council for the different genres in voluntary arts
- From 2001 2009 AKKS managed two governmental funds for projects in voluntary arts on behalf of the state
- However, to day there is no such funding and the support for voluntary art is not on the political agenda
- AKKS has therefore been through a process of redefining our role a process we are still in the middle of...

- To day we see ourselves as a political organisation working to secure visibility, infrastructure and funding for voluntary arts
- We also see ourselves as a platform for the sharing and dissemination of knowledge and information about voluntary arts both to the public and to our members
- A project about the informal learning in amateur arts and culture fits in to this just fine☺ so lets get to work!

FOLKEVIRKE in Denmark:

"Folkevirke - social - cultural political information" is a cross-country, cross-party adult education organisation founded in 1944.

Folkevirke's working fields are centered round social, cultural, and political aspects in which we wish to engage through a binding, open and unprejudiced dialogue.

Folkevirke is working across all dividing lines - social, cultural, political, geographical, religious and age-related.

Folkevirke's aim is to bring new initiative to adult education. Folkevirke wishes to promote an active dialogue, thereby offering the participants a better foundation for engaging themselves in the democratic process.

Folkevirke consists of individuals, local circles and committees which are dealing with adult education in various ways, as well as a number of affiliated organisations for which Folkevirke can be a natural cultural dimension to their professional and socially related activities.

Folkevirke publishes a cultural magazine four times a year with changing social, political and/or cultural themes, and is arranging lectures, debates, working in study circles, holds seminars etc.

The Association offers its members consultancy, seminars, courses, meetings etc.

The Association is a forum for our members to network, to exchange ideas and to find knowledge.

The Association actively uses a website and electronic newsletters.

The Association is a member of other Danish organisations within the music and culture area.

AMATÖRKULTUR – Ax in Sweden:

Ax is a network between 19 national organisations. It's not an umbrella-organisation. The type of organisations are choirs, orchestras, handcraft, photo, role-play, folk music and dance. These organisations represents about 450.000 persons. Ax is active in research projects, 'The Day of Amateur Culture' etc., but mostly active in political and economic doings. Ax is participating in many network e.g about folk high school and amateur culture education.

TALENT CITY in Latvia

Culture and education studio "Talent City" (non-governmental organization) and "Grīna" Ltd main task is to offer various traditional and innovative ways of spending free time for different age groups. Two main activity directions are: organizing various educational and creative courses and maintaining Latvian cultural heritage through ancestry traditions.

The main aim of Talent City is to unite creative and activity-interested people (different age groups, from different places in Latvia) who wish to discover and find out their talents in art, culture and turn them into dedicated hobbies in order to create wonderful masterpieces. Various crafts courses are offered to the public - bead art, decoupage, silk painting etc.

A specially designed course "Discovering Latvia in English gives an opportunity to understand the Latvian culture, traditions, language and today's situation.

Target groups - we involve various groups in our activities. Crafts are mainly for women, but some new activities like learning to tie knots or building bird -houses are planned also for men. Project target groups are single parent families, seniors and children. The organisation intends to direct its activities to other target groups as well.

The central office and training classes of the organization "Talent City" are located in the capital city of Latvia, Riga. It is very close to the Central Railway station, therefore easily accessible also for people from rural areas who want to participate in our activities.

Many volunteers are participating, but teachers are having salary.

NORSK TEATERRÅD in Norway:

Norsk Teaterråd (council) founded in 1980 is an umbrella organisation for 16 organisations. The council are mainly dealing with national and international topics for common interests for all memberorganisations. The government inspired in the foundation period the organisations to work together in one umbrella organization. In our database we have 6000 scripts of Dramas. The earlier name for the umbrella organization included the word 'amateur', but the member organisations wanted this word to be taken away because they was tired of it. The umbrella organization is taking care of paying royalty to writers etc. We have 6,5 employed. And we are covering about 125.000 persons. Also deaf people and armed forces are members.

Between meetings

In the end of each national meeting we have a nachspiel/debriefing to find out what challenges we work on in between meetings and how: thus creating a progressional project.

Result of the project

Documentation in progress – the host must document the meeting and this will be gathered at a website. Knowledge and learning will grow during the project. Functioning as outcome.

During every meeting the host will film the activities. At the end we will edit it together and put it on the website and YouTube for documentation and inspiration

We will make a website with an intranet witch will be the information platform of the whole project, both externally and internally.

Product: We will publish a booklet on the learning in amateur culture. Could be digital. E-book with translation.

Homework could be to gather lesson plans/study plans/methodology used in the theme/study guide/master class etc.

After each meeting a memo or evaluation/report must be made including minutes and an evaluation done by the host.

KICK OFF meeting: 5000 EURO

National meetings total: 41375 EURO = 8275 EURO pr. meeting. This means that 8275 EURO is the maximum you can budget with for each meeting (unless you want to budget with co-finance from for instance other funds (that may be the case in DK, N and S). Budget number of participants is: 25. Remember to include travel and accommodation for the project partners to the meetings.
